First Scripture Reading

John 15: 1-9

- 1** "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.
- 2** Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit.
- 3** You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.
- 4** Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me.
- 5** I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.
- 6** If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned.
- 7** If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you.
- 8** By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples.
- 9** "As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love.

Second Scripture Reading
(To be read in unison)

Colossians 3:10-17

- 10** and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him,
- 11** where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all.
- 12** Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering;
- 13** bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do.
- 14** But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection.
- 15** And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful.
- 16** Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.
- 17** And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.


